We are seeking applicants for potential **CAPES scholars**. CAPES Scholars will be awarded Center Faculty status, opportunities to propose investigator-initiated Pilot Projects, and access to other institutional resources, such as NIH-supported T32, KL2, and K12. There are two types of CAPES Scholars:

- Emerging Scholars: Open to graduate students, postdoctoral researchers, and early-stage investigators who can work with and learn from CAPES Faculty through formalized mentoring and didactics. Emerging Scholars will also be eligible to receive funds for approved trainings and conferences.
- Advanced Collaborating Scholars: Open to established investigators with suicide research experience who have not studied technologies, as well as those with an established

record of productivity in a complementary scientific field that offers new perspectives and methods to advance suicide prevention science.
