The soft launch of the **CAPES signature project** is happening this month! We will be testing clinical and implementation outcomes of Jaspr, a suicide prevention software that can be accessed on a tablet by emergency department patients, which makes therapeutic use of downtime before a psychiatric evaluation. Patients can download the Jaspr@home app to their smartphone and use their safety plan and tools after the visit.
