The UMass Chan IRB is pleased to announce that the new Research Management System (RMS) opens today, October 12, 2021, at 8am. The direct link is <u>https://irb.umassmed.edu</u> and an updated checklist to assist study teams with transitioning from Legacy eIRB to RMS eIRB is attached to this email.

The RMS eIRB library - accessed directly within RMS eIRB -- contains the most up-to-date forms, templates, SOPs, checklists, and worksheets. The main IRB website is being updated to reflect these changes. There are two substantive revisions to the templates - (1) a revamped HIPAA waiver and (2) an updated consent form and fact sheet. The changes to the HIPAA waiver are designed to reduce requests for clarification during pre-review and facilitate the required accounting of disclosures. The consent form and fact sheet reflect the institution's lowered threshold for collecting subject identifiers when paying incentives for participation.
