Questions for Parents to Ask at IEP Meetings

- I. What people worked together to determine eligibility for special education services?
- 2. What assessments were used to determine eligibility?
- 3. What skills is my child lacking? How can I help develop these skills at home?
- 4. Who will be administering progress monitoring?
- 5. How often will my child be progress monitored?
- 6. What assessment tools will be used for my child's progress monitoring?
- 7. What is the plan to get my child integrated into the general education setting as soon as possible?
- 8. What accommodations are going to be implemented in the general education settings to assure my child's success?
- 9. What accommodations have already been tried unsuccessfully?
- 10. How is my child's behavior impacting positively and/or negatively his/her educational progress?
- II. What experience and training do the general education teachers have in working with special education students?
- 12. If my child is being assigned a paraprofessional support, how will a positive relationship be established and maintained?
- 13. If the paraprofessional relationship is unsuccessful, how will this be determined and how quickly will it be remedied?
- 14. What happens if my child becomes too dependent on a paraprofessional?
- 15. What say will I have in the people working with my child? What if certain people are not a good fit?
- I6. What curricular modifications, if any, does my child need? What determined this?
- 17. What determined my child's required specially designed instruction (SDI) minutes? How can I be assured this is need based and not scheduled based?
- 18. What is my child's least restrictive environment (LRE)?
- 19. How can I get the most up-to-date reports on my child's IEP progress? Are daily/weekly/monthly reports available?
- 20. How is it determined who will be providing my child's specialized transportation? What if this is not a good fit?
- 21. What are my options regarding extended school year services (ESYS)?
- 22. Explain to me the transition process and supports available for post-secondary support.
- 23. What are the exact amounts of time my child will be spending in the general education setting?
- 24. What are the exact amounts of time my child will be spending in the special education setting?
- 25. What flexibility exists for the amounts of time my child spends in specific settings?
- 26. What are some the specialized curriculum and materials that will be/are used with my child?
- 27. What can I do at home to support my child's learning in the school setting?
- 28. What plans are in place to ease my child's frustrations and effectively answer his/her questions?
- 29. How are/are not peers instructed on the needs of my child or other special education students?
