Want to Get Your GED?

- What? If you want to earn a high school equivalency diploma, you'll need to take the HiSET test (formerly GED).

Need Money for College?

DCF Foster Child Tuition Waiver & Fee Assistance

- If you are in DCF custody and were not adopted or reunited with your family, this program helps pay for college.

DCF Adopted Child Tuition Waiver & Fee Assistance

- If you were adopted through DCF and are 24 or younger, you can get free or reduced tuition at public colleges.
- Ask your DCF worker or scan QR code.

MA State Government Internships

• Get work experience with the Massachusetts government.

YouthWorks – Summer & After-School Jobs

- Who can apply? Teens 14-21 from low-income families.
- What jobs? Office work, parks & recreation, childcare, retail, and more!
- How is it different from Job Corps? YouthWorks is a short-term job, while Job Corps is a long-term job training program.

Career Center - Help with Finding a Job

• Get career advice, job listings, training programs, and resume help.

Job Corps – Job Training & Housing

- What is it? A federally funded program that trains young people for real careers like construction, healthcare, IT, and more.
- **Do you get housing?** Yes! You can live on campus for free.
- Who can apply? Ages 16-24.
- Important: You must pass a drug test.

MassAbility (Mass Rehab Commission) – Job Help for Youth with Disabilities

- What is it? A government program that pays for job training, work tools, and other job-related needs.
- Who can apply? If you have ADHD, learning disabilities, or other challenges that make working harder.
- How to apply? Ask your DCF worker
