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COMMUNITY LEGAL AID

- "Provides free legal help with non-criminal problems such as evictions, foreclosures, domestic violence, unfair consumer practices, and access to disability benefits."
 - <150% Federal Poverty Line</p>
 - Functional navigation through the legal process
 - Top concerns from previous PHC: 1. Paying bills, 2. Health insurance, 3. Food access





COMMUNITY HEALTHLINK

 "Promoting, restoring, and maintaining the physical health, mental health and dignity of adults, children and families in Central Massachusetts who are experiencing mental illness, addiction or homelessness."

- Inpatient and outpatient services
- Intensive and early intervention
- Regain/maintain patient health, dignity, and life stability

CLERKSHIP PROJECT

Goal: identify patterns of unmet needs in the community that could potentially benefit from legal aid resources.

Needs assessment survey administered at three clinical sites:

- Adult Outpatient Clinic
- Substance Use Continuum
- Youth and Family Services Outpatient Counseling

Surveyed areas of concern:

- Benefits/Finances
- Housing/Utilities
- Education/Employment
- Personal and Family Stability





INTERPROFESSIONALISM

Case Managers & Social Workers

- Coordinate care transitions from acute to long term recovery
- Advocate for clients suffering from food, housing, or other resource insecurities

Mental Health Professionals

Address underlying psychological comorbidities affecting inpatient and outpatient population

Legal Staff

- Navigate complex and esoteric system governing addiction recovery
- Advise *pro se* clients in housing, family, and other Worcester courts

Ancillary Inpatient/Outpatient Medical Staff

- Provide and administer opioid use disorder medical therapy
- Treat comorbidities disproportionately affecting those with opioid use disorder





OVERARCHING FINDINGS

95 Completed Surveys:

- Substance Use Continuum (55)
- Adult Outpatient Clinic (38)
- Youth and Family Outpatient Counseling (2)*

Top 3 Concerns:

- Having enough money to pay bills each month
- Having enough healthy food to eat each day
- Medicare/Medicaid/health insurance





COMMUNITY HEALTHLINK SUBSTANCE USE CONTINUUM

55 patient surveys

- Endorsed Concerns for Themselves and/or Family Members:
 - Benefits/Finances (100%)
 - Housing/Utilities (67%)
 - Education/Employment (60%)
 - Personal/Family Stability (29%)









COMMUNITY HEALTHLINK OUTPATIENT THAYER BUILDING

38 patient surveys

- Endorsed Concerns for Themselves and/or Family Members:
 - Benefits/Finances (79%)
 - Housing/Utilities (55%)
 - Education/Employment (37%)
 - Personal/Family Stability (5%)



% Respondents Expressing Concern - Substance Use Continuum





TAKEAWAYS

Overall: there was significant overlap of top 5 concerns

- Monthly Bills > Healthy Food > Insurance > *** > Employment
- Exception: SNAP (inpatient) vs Disability Benefits (outpatient)

Future modifications

- Establish optimal clinic hours for survey administration
- Standardize guidelines for competency/guardianship
- Interpreters/surveys in multiple languages
