The focus of the UMMS GSN Doctorate of Nursing Practice (DNP) program is to prepare graduates as nurse practitioners in leadership roles. The curriculum is designed to educate students to improve and transform health care through advanced clinical knowledge, research translation, and systems leadership. Graduates are prepared to assume advanced practice nurse leadership roles in hospitals, health care organizations, and schools of nursing.

The BSN to DNP prepares students to meet the objectives of The Essentials of Doctoral Education for Advanced Nursing Practice (AACN, 2006), the Nurse Practitioner Core Competencies (NONPF, 2012), as well as the Population Focused Competencies for Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioners (NONPF, 2013).
