Our team includes a fellowship-trained Movement Disorders neurologist, genetic counselor, nurse navigator, speech therapist, and social worker. We aim to have members of the team present during your initial evaluation and throughout your journey with Huntington's Disease.

Our team also collaborates with other specialists and experts through consultation services for areas such as

genetic testing, nutrition screening, rehabilitation therapies, palliative care, neuropsychology, and neuropsychiatry.

HD Current and Ongoing Research



Dr. Kara Smith from UMass is collaborating with researchers at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center to study speech problems in Huntington's Disease (HD). The team plans to explore innovative new ways to use speech and technology to better understand and monitor HD symptoms. The goal of this research is to learn more about the speech changes that occur in Huntington's disease and how they may be similar or different from other neurological conditions like Parkinson's disease, and then to develop tools that will use speech information gathered and analyzed by technology in order to monitor changes over time in patients with HD.

Speech Language Pathology and Huntington's Disease

You or your loved one with HD may have trouble with speech and/or swallowing. These are commonly referred to as

- Dysarthria (dis-AR-three-yuh): A condition that leads to slurred and difficult to understand speech, and
- Dysphagia (dis-FAY-juh): Difficulty swallowing. This can include difficulty coordinating muscles to keep food in the mouth, chewing and/or food/liquids "going down the wrong way".

Your doctor may refer you to see a Speech Language Pathologist to further assess these concerns and guide you with improving you/your loved one's ability to communicate and improve safety with eating and drinking.
