Research Methods Meeting Wednesday, February 5th, 10:00-11:00 AM

Title: LLM for Clinical Evidence Retrieval and Summarization

Presenter: Yifan Peng, Ph.D., FACMI, is an Associate Professor in the Department of Population

Health Sciences at Weill Cornell Medicine

Description: In medicine, our understanding of diseases, treatments, and preventive measures is perpetually advancing. Despite this, the existing framework of evidence-based medicine (EBM) faces formidable challenges from information overload, as no clinician can catch up with the explosive publication paces and lacks a robust mechanism for the continuous integration of new evidence. The advent of Generative AI, exemplified by large language models (LLMs) signifies a potentially transformative development in the methodologies employed to collect, appraise, disseminate, and interact with clinical evidence. In this talk, I will discuss our research on addressing the "lostin-the-middle" issue in evidence retrieval and the fine-tuning of LLMs for effective medical evidence summarization. Bio: Dr. Peng's main research interests include BioNLP and medical image analysis. He has published in major Al and healthcare informatics venues, including ACL, NAACL, CVPR, and MICCAI, as well as medical venues, including Nature Medicine, Nucleic Acids Research, npj Digital Medicine, and JAMIA. His research has been funded by federal agencies, including NIH and NSF and industries such as Amazon and Google. He received the AMIA New Investigator Award in 2023. Kathy Whalen has worked in the addictions field as a Technology Transfer Specialist for the Opioid Response Network since 2019. She received her BSN in 1981 from SUNY Downstate Medical Center College of Nursing. Prior to her work with the Opioid Response Network, worked as a pediatric nurse for 15 years. Kathy's primary area interest is adolescent and transitional age substance use and integrated care. Kathy enjoys a good cup of coffee and traveling with her husband and their four daughters.

Jenna Fuld has worked in the addictions and behavioral health field for nearly a decade. She received her BA in Psychology from Roger Williams University in 2014.
