**Michael R. Kauth, PhD** was recently appointed Professor in the Department of Psychiatry, with a secondary appointment in the Department of Population and Quantitative Health Sciences.

Dr. Kauth is a clinical psychologist and the first Executive Director of the LGBTQ+ Health Program in the Department of Veterans Affairs. He leads the development and implementation of health policy and best practices for Veterans who have lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and similar identities (LGBTQ+). He has led efforts to develop routine data collection processes for sexual orientation and gender identity in VHA and the use of these data to understand and address health inequities experienced by LGBTQ+ Veterans. Dr. Kauth has published over 80 peer-reviewed journal articles, 4 books, and 16 book chapters on LGBTQ Veteran health, sexual health, implementation of educational

interventions, and the evolution of same-sex attraction. In August 2023, Dr. Kauth moved to Worcester with his husband, Matthew Horsfield, MD, and their dog, Ben.

### PQHS SHOUT OUT – INSPIRING STORY



Adrian Zai's daughter **Amelia Zai** was honored by the Boston Celtics as a Hero Among Us during halftime of the Boston Celtics home game on December 29, 2023, for her extraordinary empathy and dedication to serving others.

In 2016, Amelia received a diagnosis of Ewing sarcoma. The development generated feelings of isolation and fear. But it also led to her motivation to support fellow pediatric cancer patients who may be experiencing the same emotions.

Using the wish that she was given from Make-A-Wish Massachusetts and Rhode Island, Amelia created a therapeutic activity book for pediatric cancer patients. Her goal in creating her book, <u>Amelia Takes on Cancer</u>, was to alleviate the emotional burden that patients and their families experience during treatment. Book sale proceeds are donated to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. So far, thousands of dollars have been donated.

**Title:** Integrating Wearable Devices into Lifestyle Interventions and Healthcare System Workflows: Closing the Feedback Loop

**Speaker:** Garrett Ash, PhD; Assistant Professor of Medicine, Biomedical Informatics, and Data Science; Yale School of Medicine

**Description:** Learning to exercise with type 1 diabetes requires that standard guidelines be followed up by trial-and-error lived experience. Our Type 1 Diabetes Digital Exercise Support platform provides exercise guidance, motivation, and multimodal biometric feedback in a closed

loop where the feedback supports the guidance and motivation. The study is also capturing real-time surveys of affective motivation states for activity and rest to study their relationship with glycemic variation and fear of dysglycemia. Finally, we have several quality improvement (QI) projects integrating this model into the Veterans Affairs Healthcare System to treat other chronic diseases.
