

Welcome to PQHS! Rosemarie Martin, PhD, will join PQHS on September 1 as a Professor in the Division of Preventive and Behavioral Medicine. Rosemarie's program of community-engaged research broadly focuses on developing and evaluating innovative behavioral and pharmacologic interventions for substance use disorders. Her NIH research grants, and SAMHSA-funded services and training grants have centered on reducing disparities in treatment delivery and facilitating treatment access for individuals for whom treatment is not readily available, particularly those with criminal legal system involvement. She works extensively alongside community partners to

change the landscape of treatment available to justice-involved individuals. Rosemarie joins UMass Chan from the Department of Behavioral and Social Sciences at Brown University. <u>Dr. Bo Wang</u> has been awarded two NIH grants (R34MH134682, NIH/NIMH; 1R21HD114519, NIH/NICHD). The R34 project, titled "Optimizing Mobile Interventions to Overcome Stigma and Promote HIV Prevention Among Thai Young Transgender Women," will develop and test a multi-component, mHealth intervention aimed at reducing HIV-related stigma and improving the use of HIV prevention services among HIV-negative young transgender women in Thailand.

The R21 project, titled "Exploring Sustained Implementation and Fidelity of an Evidence-Based HIV Prevention Program," is a follow-up study that will investigate the implementation trajectories among

teachers and the multi-level determinants influencing the sustainability of HIV behavioral interventions integrated into the existing curriculum across the government school system. Congratulations to Dr. Wang on securing these important grants!



<u>Jennifer Tjia MD, MSCE</u> is senior author on NEJM article calling for collection of sexual orientation, gender identity data - Jennifer Tjia, MD, MSCE, is the senior author on a recently published perspective in the New England Journal of Medicine that calls for more routine—but cautious—collection of data on patients' sexual orientation and gender identity. UMass ARC PBRN Pilot Project Awards 2024 Call for Applications: Letters of intent are due September 16, 2024

The UMass Ambulatory Research Consortium (ARC) practice-based research network (PBRN) welcomes submissions for pilot project awards. Study teams should include a practicing clinician and a health services investigator. Awardees will have access to support from PBRN core staff, the DOM Research Core, and CCTS cores, as appropriate for the project. Projects that address one or more of the following areas are encouraged:

- Development or piloting of interventions focused on improving health outcomes, patient engagement, or patient/caregiver experience in primary care
- Development or piloting of interventions that address clinician satisfaction or engagement in primary care
- Research topics that are relevant to primary care
- New approaches to linking practices to community-based organizations to improve health outcomes or health equity
