<u>Grace Ryan, PhD, MPH</u> received funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for her project titled, "ARISe Center for Rural Vaccination at UMass Chan Medical School." Over the five-year funding period, the team will conduct research focused to test effectiveness of vaccine promotion messages in rural populations and then use those findings to inform adaptation and testing of a community-led vaccine ambassador program in rural New England communities. The

team is partnering with the New England Rural Health Association who will support efforts around community outreach and engagement and dissemination.

The UMass Ambulatory Research Consortium (ARC) practice-based research network (PBRN) welcomes submissions for pilot project awards. Study teams should include a practicing clinician and a health services investigator. Awardees will have access to support from PBRN core staff, the DOM Research Core, and CCTS cores, as appropriate for the project. Projects that address one or more of the following areas are encouraged:

- Development or piloting of interventions focused on improving health outcomes, patient engagement, or patient/caregiver experience in primary care
- Development or piloting of interventions that address clinician satisfaction or engagement in primary care
- Research topics that are relevant to primary care
- New approaches to linking practices to community-based organizations to improve health outcomes or health equity
