Research Methods Meeting Wednesday, December 18th, 10:00 – 11:00 AM <u>Title</u>: Why does it matter and what does it mean to validate a model? <u>Presenters</u>: Arlene Ash, PhD and Randall Ellis, PhD <u>Bios</u>: Dr. Ash has a PhD in mathematics and is Division Chief of Biostatistics and Health Services Research in PQHS. Dr. Ellis has a PhD in economics and is a professor in the

Economics Department in the College of Arts and Sciences at Boston University. The speakers have worked together, since the mid-1980s, to develop risk models for managing health care that are now used by the federal government and many others.

Description: We will share learning from decades of model building and testing, including: what questions are answered by different kinds of validation procedures; how validation and cross-validation differ; why validation is crucial when N is small, especially compared to p (the number of potential predictors); which aspects of models or measures of model performance might be unstable, even when built on 10s of millions of observations and p is not large; why and how to use bootstrapping for cross-validation (and how to do so efficiently with huge Ns).
