Jennifer Tjia, MD named U.S. Fulbright Scholar for Netherlands

Dr. Tjia is traveling to the Netherlands this fall to spend four months focusing on a project aimed at optimizing medication prescribing for older adults.

Dr. Tjia has been selected as a Fulbright U.S. Scholar for the Netherlands, a prestigious fellowship and unique opportunity to teach and conduct research at Leiden University in Leiden, Netherlands.

Hoa Nguyen, MD, MS, PhD received grant funding from The Alzheimer's Association, "Digital Storytelling to Promote Early Dementia Diagnosis in Rural Vietnam". Can digital storytelling, delivered through mobile phones, help people in rural Vietnam better understand dementia and encourage early screening and diagnosis?

This study could lead to a simple, affordable way to help families recognize dementia earlier and get support sooner. Because it uses real stories from Vietnamese communities and works on smartphones, it is especially promising for rural areas where there may be fewer doctors and limited health resources. If the approach proves effective, it could be used in other low-

resource settings to increase awareness, reduce stigma, and improve early detection of dementia. This would help families plan ahead, connect with treatment options, and reduce the burden of caregiving in the long run.
