After graduating from Princeton University, he completed his medical education at Mount Sinai School of medicine and his residencies in General Surgery at Harvard Medical School and in Otolaryngology and Facial Plastic Surgery at Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary. After a much respected career at Fallon Clinic, he opened his own practice—Bentkover Facial Plastic Surgery

and Laser Center—in 2002, here in Worcester. His legacy will be forever remembered by all of us whose lives he touched, both personally and professionally.
