Psychiatric illness

-Acute psychosis/mania
-Disorganization
-Negative symptoms
-Cognitive difficulties

Medical comorbidities

- -Diabetes

THE SOLUTION





QI project at Freedom Trail Clinic

- Problem
 - Patients with SMI have lower vaccination rates than general population
 - Psychiatric providers are a missed opportunity (trust, skill set, frequent contact)
- Aim
 - Achieve 90% COVID-19 vaccination rate in our clozapine clinic
- Intervention
 - Engage and enlist psychiatric providers in the vaccine effort
 - Improve process (standardize vaccine discussion, tracking tool)
- Outcome
 - Pending (target date June 30, 2021)

Preventive care (vaccinations) as legitimate role for mental health care system

- Increase COVID-19 vaccination uptake
 - Enlist mental health staff to overcome barriers
 - Ensure patient follow-up with vaccination series completion
 - Explore mobile clinic at the FTC (with a pharmacist) to offer "shots in arms" in a mental health setting
- Broaden vaccination efforts beyond COVID-19

 Annual flu vaccine
- View vaccination equity as part of larger effort to reduce health disparities
